- NH DHHS
  - Suicide is the 8th leading cause of death in NH among multiple age groups
  - o 22% of deaths by suicide in the US involve alcohol use
  - 20% of deaths by suicide in the US involve opioid use
  - Substance use prevention, treatment & recovery **is** suicide prevention
  - SBIRT can help identify those who are at risk of suicide
  - Frameworks for successful messaging focus on the positive
  - NH State Suicide Prevention Plan
    - Promote Awareness
    - Reduce Stigma
- <u>NAMI</u>
  - NAMI 's Connect Suicide Prevention and Postvention program includes training, protocols, and consultation; Children and Youth services are also available
- Connor's Climb Foundation

- SOS Signs of Suicide Prevention Program is an evidence-based universal program that targets the entire population (like an entire grade or school) to ensure everyone gets the trainings and prevents the adult assumption of who may or may not need the skills
- Connor's Climb Foundation also offers in-person and Online SOS Suicide
   Prevention Trainings, ongoing TA and support, anonymous online behavioral
   health screening, and upstream awareness activities
